***Course Fees for Pre-University Programmes marked with an *, do not include medical insurance whereby a separate fee of €200 is required.**

Please note:

1. From 2004/2005 the national structure of qualifications awarded to successful students changed. In the past, there have been three levels of award, known as Degree, Diploma and Certificate. The new titles for these HETAC courses are: Honours Bachelor Degree - **Level 8**, Bachelor Degree - **Level 7** and Higher Certificate - **Level 6**
2. These fees are fixed at the most economic price possible. No negotiation of fees will be entertained.
3. Course fees must be paid prior to visa application. A separate statement will be issued in November for registration & examination fees.
4. Course fees must be discharged by Swift Transfer. Formal documentation will be supplied to you after a Provisional Offer has been made.
5. Course fees are not refundable except under exceptional circumstances such as visa refusal, in which case course fees will be refunded less an administration fee.
6. Course fees quoted are in respect of 2007/2008 academic year only. Course fees for subsequent academic years will be subject to price increases.
7. Fees for the internship year will depend on the availability of places on the work internship programme. If there are insufficient places, the college reserves the right to change the internship to project work and lectures. In this event, the college will increase the fees to reflect this.
8. Currency payments are translated into Euro and credited to students at the rate applicable on the date remittance is processed through the College's bank account. All fees are quoted in Euro. Any shortfall in the currency translation must be made good by the student. Refunds (made in exceptional cases only) will be made in Euro and not the currency in which fees have been paid.
9. Course fees include a charge for Medical Insurance (approved by the college) which is required by the Irish Government and visa regulations.
10. Course commencement and start date is dependent on a viable cohort formation.
11. Griffith College Dublin reserves the right to change any of the details or regulations on its web-site, brochure or any other printed material.
12. All students for whom English is not their first language will be required to sit an English language test prior to the commencement of their course. Students whose level of English does not meet the required standard will be redirected onto the Certificate in Business Studies in Intercultural Studies. On successful completion of examinations in Semester 1, students may be allowed to commence their original first choice programme (subject to appropriate numbers). Should students be required to take a second semester on the Certificate in Business Studies in Intercultural Studies, the fee due will be €4500.00. This fee is separate to fees secured already.
13. Students classified for fee purposes as Non-EU on application shall retain that fee status and continue to pay Non-EU fees for the duration of their course following admission, whether studying full-time or part-time and irrespective of holding a work permit.
14. + The LLB and BABS year one, full-time course fees incorporate an additional sum to cover the core texts for each subject. These will be distributed at course commencement.
